La Emi also studied with Ivan Vargas Heredia, José Galván, Gala Vivancos, Inmaculada Ortega, Yolanda Heredia, Juana Amaya, Juan Paredes, Torombo, Rocio Alcaide Ruiz, and many more influential Flamenco dancers. For three seasons, she performed with the Juan Siddi Flamenco Santa Fe. In 2014, Vicente Griego and La Emi began her own company, *EmiArteFlamenco* with Skylight Santa Fe as its home theater. In 2016 she opened *EmiArteFlamenco Academy* offering classes for toddlers, children and adults. Emi Arte Flamenco will begin its second summer season at the Lodge in Santa Fe (July3-September 1). As a relatively young artist, La Emi has toured the world and has taken her rightful place as a dynamic and influential Flamenco artist. She has created the ensemble for this evening's performance.
